

# 1936 Graf Zeppelin Mail Service

In 1936 the Hindenburg began commercial airmail service, a new airship terminal opened at Frankfurt am Main, and zeppelin mail deliveries were even more closely integrated into those of the Deutsche Lufthansa South Atlantic service.

**1936 Graf Zeppelin Schedule** - Thirteen flights every two weeks from April to November.

**The Hindenburg** - New zeppelin began regular transatlantic service in late March - Schedules of the two airships were coordinated on the South American service.

**New Airship Terminal at Frankfurt am Main** - Opened in May - South America mail was processed there, even though the Graf Zeppelin flew from either Friedrichshafen or Frankfurt.

**Closer Integration with DLH** - The portion of the route on which the Graf Zeppelin carried the mail decreased through out the year - When the Spanish Civil War prevented exchanges at Seville in July, exchange points were moved progressively closer to South America.

Montélimar - Lisbon - Las Palmas - Bathurst.

**New Cachet Code Letters** - Cachet code letter locations were reassigned when the new terminal opened at Frankfurt am Main in May.

## FIRST TO FOURTH 1936 FLIGHTS

**Temporary Loss of Letter Mail Franchise** - From April to June all letter mail was again flown by DLH.

**Bolivia** - Zeppelin airmail dispatches from Bolivia resumed after the Gran Chaco war with Paraguay ended in early 1936.

Date in the Prague postmark confirms carriage by zeppelin.

Postage 1.70 = 1.50 boliviano airmail, .25 surface.

Hungary - From a smelting and metalwork company near Budapest - Stamps on back for 3.50 pengő airmail beyond Brazil, .40 surface.

Sent by Pneumatic Mail within Munich - Time clock marking 1A 26 JUL 25 N2 55 on back shows the letter arrived by pneumatic tube at central post office 1A at 2:55 p.m. - No extra charge for this internal service - Postage RM 1.50 airmail beyond Brazil, .25 surface.

 **Mail Exchange at Montélimar - Only Mail for France and Italy was Exchanged** - After the exchange DLH flew the mail to Marseille for delivery by the French and Italians - Mail for other countries was flown by the zeppelin to Frankfurt am Main.

**ZEPPELIN ROUTES DISRUPTED BY SPANISH CIVIL WAR**

The zeppelin routes to South America were changed to avoid passing over Spain when the Civil War began in July 1936.

**A French airfield at Montélimar was used as an exchange point on an emergency basis.**

**British India to Brazil** - Flown from Calcutta to Europe by British Imperial Airways - Reached Europe at a date and time when the Graf Zeppelin provided the next airmail service to Brazil - Postage 46 annas airmail rate from India to Brazil, 3½ annas surface.

Rio arrival marking 16 August confirms zeppelin delivery.

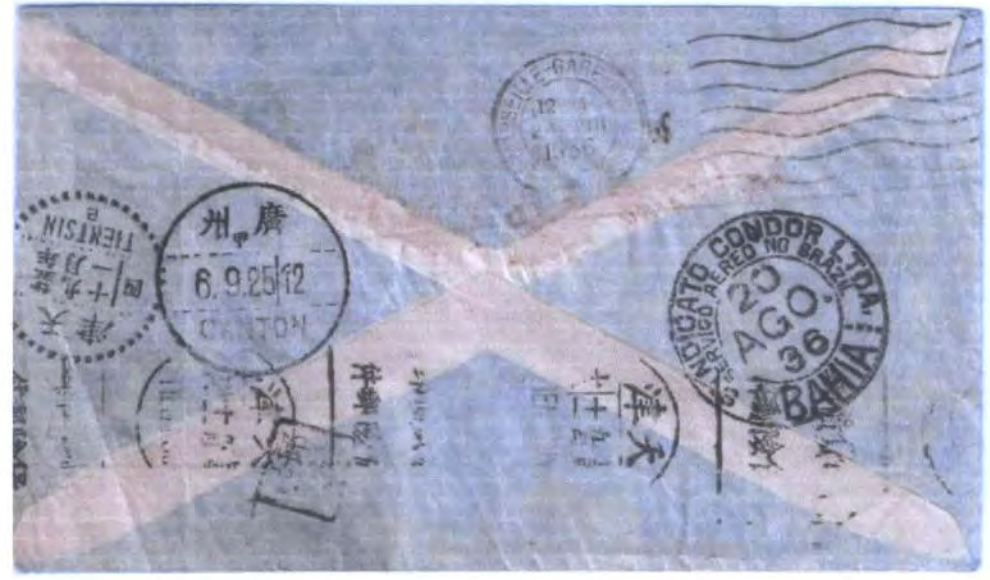

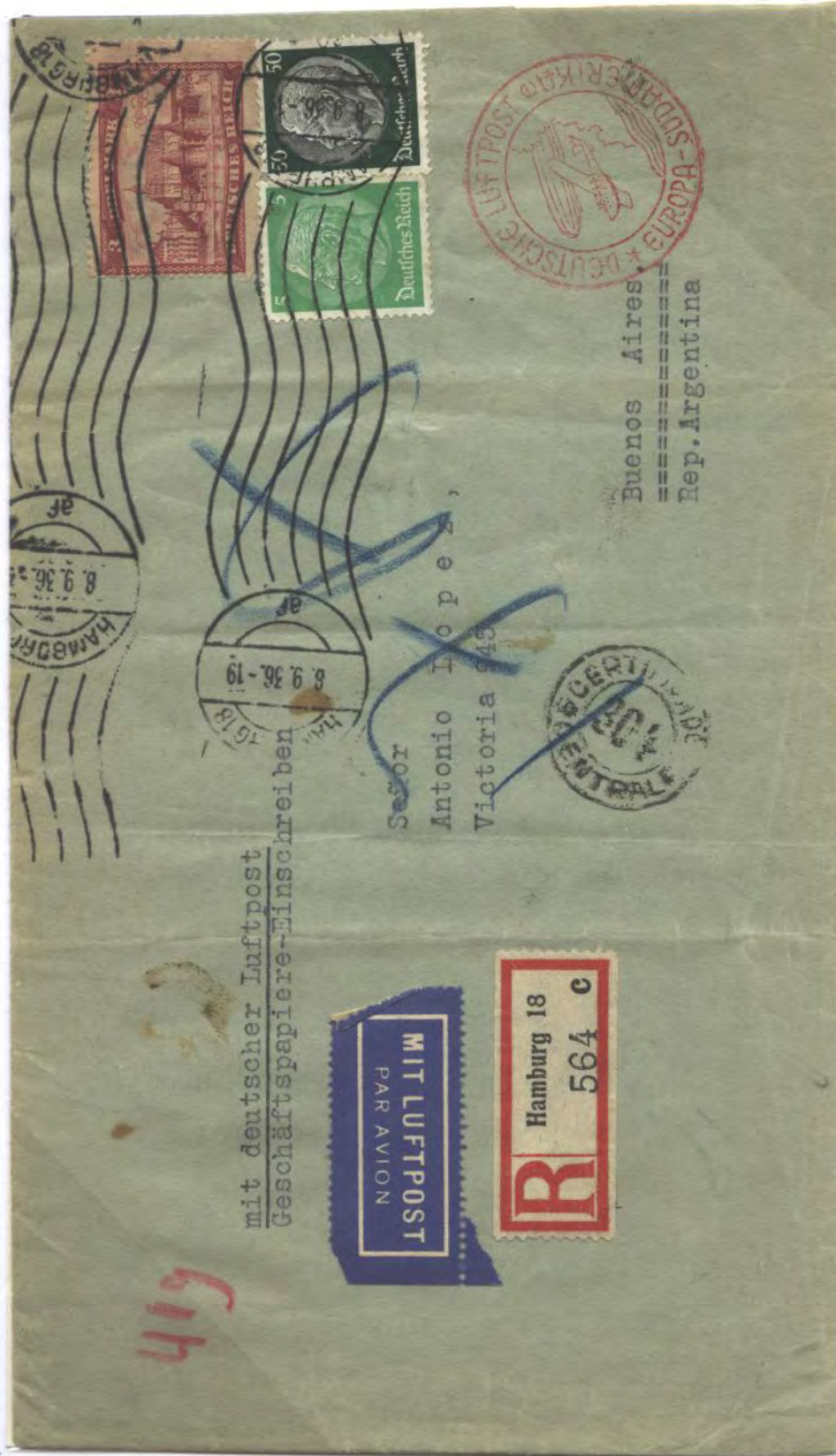

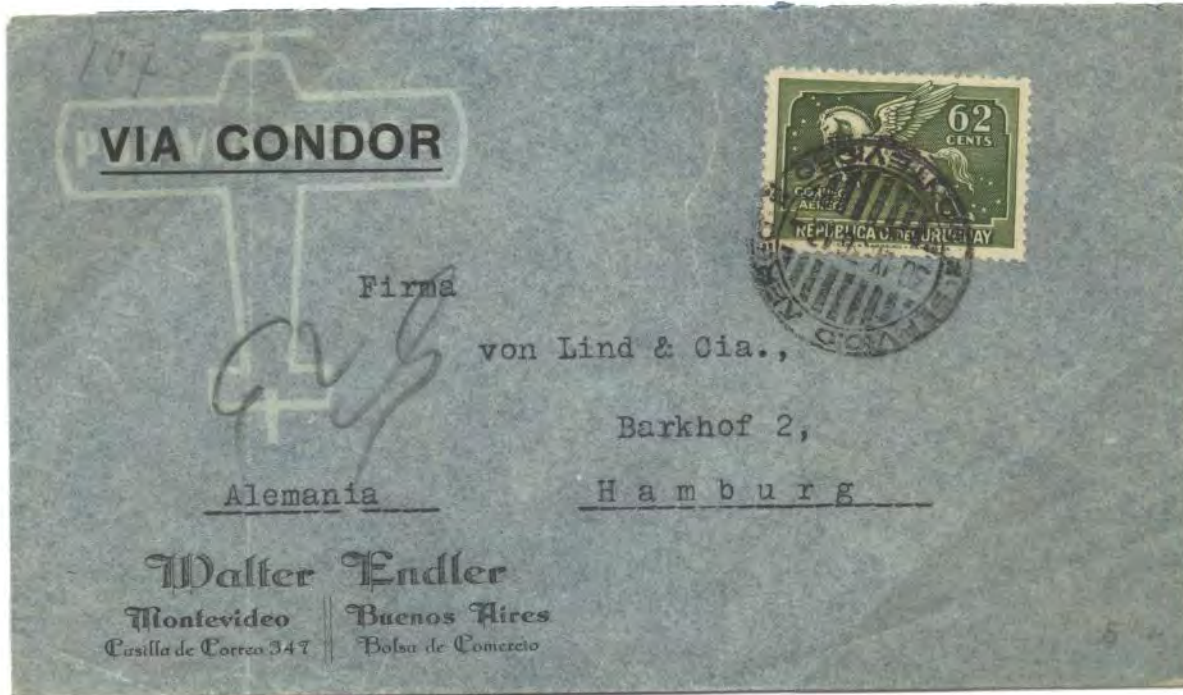

**Peru - By PANAGRA to Santiago, for the Condor Connection to Recife** - Airmail routing from Peru to Europe depended on the day of the week - Sunday dispatches were carried across the South Atlantic by the German airmail service, which during this week was flown by the Graf Zeppelin - Postage 3.15 sol airmail (2 x 1.50 per five grams), .15 surface.

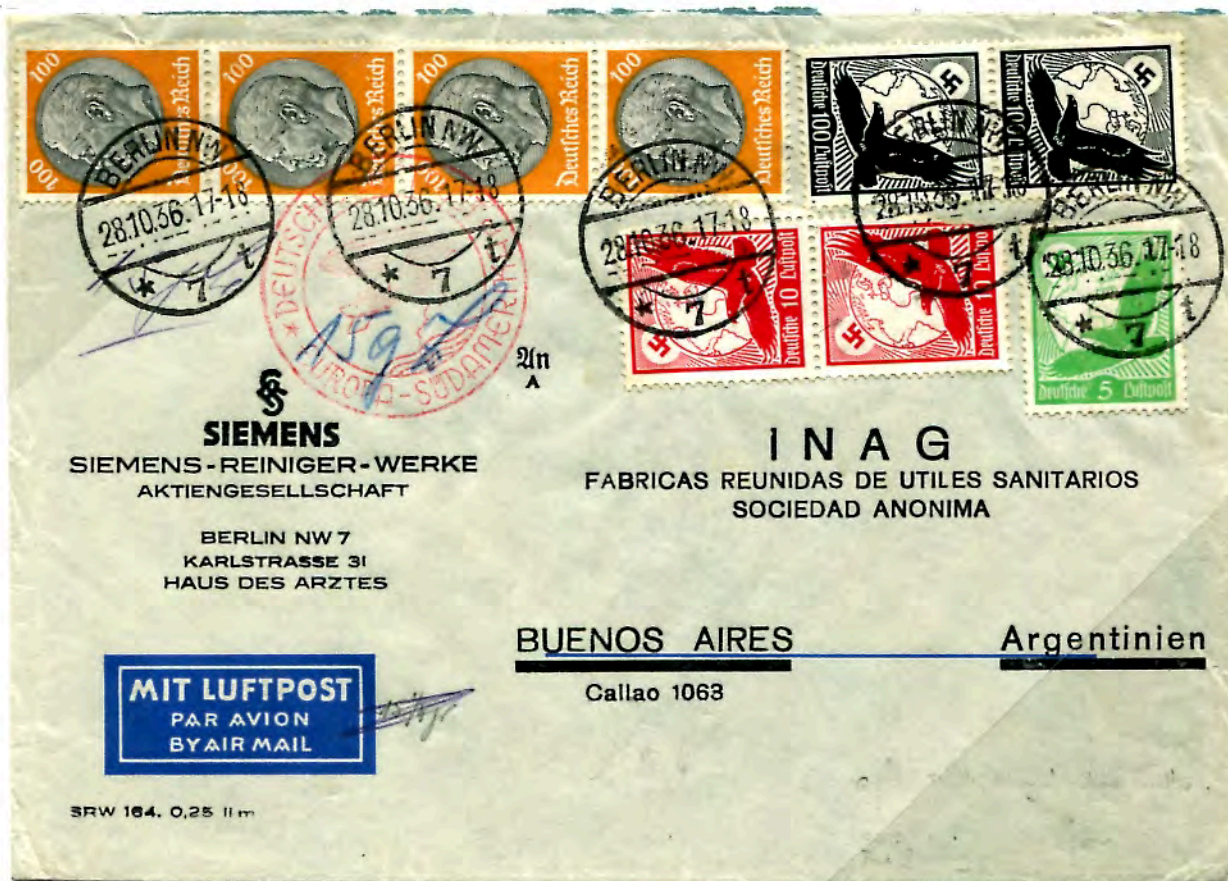


**Unsuccessful Transfer Flight** - The flight from Friedrichshafen to Frankfurt am Main turned back because of clouds and fog.

**British India to Uruguay** - Flown from Calcutta to Europe by Dutch airline KLM - Reached Europe at a date and time when the Graf Zeppelin provided the next airmail service to South America - Postage 54 annas airmail rate from India beyond Brazil, 3½ annas surface.

Bathurst was the outbound exchange point for the rest of the 1936 zeppelin season.

**LAST GRAF ZEPPELIN FLIGHT TO CARRY LETTER MAIL ACROSS SOUTH ATLANTIC**

The Zeppelin Company lost the franchise to carry letter mail to South America at the end of the 1936 season - The Graf Zeppelin carried only heavy items and mail posted on board on her flights to Brazil in 1937.
